#### **Council Officer Elections**



#### **Knights of Columbus Insurance**

## Knights Join Initiative to Protect Religious Freedom in Connecticut

A pivotal battle for religious liberty is being fought in Connecticut, as the state legislature considers a bill that codifies last year's state Supreme Court ruling imposing same-sex marriage.

The Knights of Columbus has an especially strong interest in the issue because the Supreme Council headquarters, which employs some 750 people, is located in New Haven, 40 miles from the State Capitol.

Bill 899 was reported out of the Judiciary Committee on March 30 with virtually no religious liberty protection for churches, religious groups like the Knights of Columbus, or individuals who wish to act in accordance with their sincerely-held religious beliefs.

The bill also would repeal a section of existing law that bars the state from promoting homosexuality in schools or requiring the teaching of homosexuality as an acceptable lifestyle, and from establishing numerical goals, quotas or other affirmative action for homosexuals.

This provision sets the stage for legal attacks against any teacher, church or organization that does not accept and celebrate alternative sexual lifestyles.

Bill 899 is the work of the same joint legislative committee that in recent weeks tried to push through bills allowing assisted suicide and stripping Catholic bishops and priests of their governing authority.

Both bills were quickly tabled when the Knights of Columbus led a broad-based phone and e-mail campaign of protest.

The fight against Bill 899 involves a broad coalition of groups that the Order has worked with previously, in addition to the state's Catholic bishops and the Connecticut Catholic Conference.

The Family Institute of Connecticut, the National Organization for Marriage, and a number of faith-based groups and churches in the state are all weighing in on the dangers of failing to provide religious liberty protections in the wake of the state Supreme Court's 4-3 decision in Kerrigan v. Commissioner of Public Health last October.

"Well, your Holiness, I don't like to brag, but even though I've played some pretty terrific rounds of golf in my life, this was the best I have ever played. I must have been inspired from above. My drives were long and true, my irons were accurate and purposeful, and my putting was perfect. With all due respect, my play was truly miraculous

"There's bad news?" The Pope asked.

Yes, Nicklaus sighed. "I lost to Rabbi Tiger Woods by three strokes."


