Number of Priests on the Rise

According to the newest pontifical yearbook, the number of Catholic priests has steadily increased between the years 2000 and 2006. In 2007, eight new episcopal sees were created by Pope Benedict XVI, as well as one apostolic prefecture, two metropolitan sees and one apostolic vicariate; 169 new bishops were also appointed. From year-end 2005 to year-end 2006, the latest date for which numbers are available, the number of Catholics in the world increased from 1.115 billion to 1.131 billion, a growth rate of 1.4%. Over the same period, the number of bishops grew to 4,898 from 4,841, The number of religious and an increase of 1.2%. diocesan priests passed from 406,411 in 2005 to 407,262 in 2006 (a growth rate of 0.21%). The number of priests has grown steadily from 2000 to 2006.

However, the actual distribution of priests differs from continent to continent. The numbers of priests have regrettably fallen in Europe and North America, but during the same period have increased in Africa and Asia. Students of philosophy and theology in diocesan and religious seminaries now number 115,480, an increase of 0.9% from year-end 2005 to year-end 2006.
