Catholics react favorably to pope's visit

New polling data released on May 8 shows that Pope Benedict XVI's visit to the United States produced a sharp jump in the proportion of American Catholics with a more positive view of the pope following his trip.

The proportion of practicing Catholics describing the Holy Father positively as a spiritual leader went from 70 percent before the visit to 82 percent afterward. Among non-practicing Catholics, the proportion went from 62 percent before the visit to 79 percent afterward.

A majority of Catholics, 54 percent, said they were more in touch with their spiritual values as a result of the pope's visit, and 41 percent said they were more likely to vote in the November elections as a result. 64 percent of Catholics said they better understand the Catholic Church's position on important issues as a result of the trip. Among the other key findings:

- 88 percent of practicing Catholics and 73 percent of non-practicing Catholics say the trip met or exceeded their expectations.
- 72 percent of Catholics have a more positive view of the Church as a result of the visit, including 82 percent of practicing Catholics and 56 percent of non-practicing Catholics.
- 81 percent of Catholics practicing and nonpracticing – have a positive view of Pope Benedict, compared to 63 percent before the visit.
- 82 percent of American Catholics view Pope Benedict positively as a world leader

Also important, 50 percent say they are more likely to lead a moral life and make family a bigger part of their lives, while nearly 40 percent say they are more likely to become more active in their community or church.

Supreme Knight Carl Anderson said that the poll results show clearly that Pope Benedict has presented the Catholics of the United States with a tremendous opportunity. "Americans are a religious people, and they responded very positively to the message of faith, hope, and love that the Holy Father delivered throughout his visit. It is now up to all of us in the Catholic community to walk through the door he has opened for us, and work together to build a civilization of love."
