Our Holy Father Pope Benedict XVI has declared Knights of Columbus founder Father Michael J. McGivney a "venerable Servant of God" and lauded his "vision and zeal" that led to establishment of the Catholic fraternal benefit organization.

Father McGivney's cause for sainthood has been under consideration at the Vatican since 2000. In March 2008, Pope Benedict XVI approved a decree recognizing the heroic virtue of Father McGivney. The decree significantly boosts his cause

for sainthood. It also gives the Connecticut parish priest the distinction of "Venerable Servant of God." If he is canonized, McGivney would be the first American-born priest named as saint.

During his homily at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York on April 19, 2008, the pope spoke of "the remarkable accomplishment of that exemplary American priest, the Venerable Michael McGivney, whose vision and zeal led to the establishment of the Knights of Columbus."

Marrella replaces Paul Devin, who retired after eight years as supreme advocate. Marrella has served as deputy assistant U.S. attorney general and prior to that as assistant U.S. attorney. He is a graduate of Harvard Law School and the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard. He is also a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Amherst College.

Fourth Degree Emblem

What does our fourth degree emblem mean? The emblem of the Fourth Degree features three symbols, the Dove, Cross. and Globe. The Dove, classic symbol of the Holy Spirit and Peace is shown hovering over the orb of the earth. Both are mounted on a variation of the Crusader's Cross that which was found on the tunics and capes of the Crusading Knights who battled to regain the Holy Land from the pagans

Our honored Order cherishes as its patron Christopher Columbus.

- Columbus Dove of Peace

Symbolizing the Paraclete Spirituality, the sacred symbol of the emblem typify the union of the three divine persons embodied in one Godhead, the most blessed Trinity.


- The Globe God the Father, creator of the universe.
- The Cross God the Son, the redeemer of mankind
- The Dove God the Holy Spirit, the sanctifier of humanity.

The colors are red, white, and blue.

- The cross, red
- The dove, white
- The globe, blue

The red, white, and blue are the colors of the flag of the United States, the nation in which our order was originated, and used to stress the principle of the fourth degree, Patriotism.
